



Provides homeless individuals help with the deposit and possibly one (1) to two (2) months' rent depending on the total cost. Must have a birth certificate, social security card, and ID to qualify. Starting annually in October, funds are available on a first-come, first-served basis for homeless individuals with income, but they will always take applications. If you were evicted, you will need to provide that notice. Ask for Carrie when calling.

Hours of operation: Monday through Thursday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

ASL Classes:

- For children 6 months to 4 years old: Every Monday for 6 weeks, four times a year. Cost is \$40 for parents and child, and \$50 for families with 2 or more children.
- For children 6 to 17 years old: Three summer camps available, prices and times vary depending on enrollment. Please check the <u>DHHC Facebook page</u> for price, time, and adventures.
- For adults: ASL 1 class is offered four times a year and is held every Monday for 6 weeks; cost is \$60 per person. Discounts available for families and seniors. Remote courses available.

Silent Senior Citizens Program: Seniors meet every Wednesday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. to play games, have lunch, and have fun.

Technology Specialist will help people with a hearing disadvantage learn what type of hearing assisted technology, devices, resources, and accommodations are available to help them. Ask for Thomas.



Access Specialists are trained by Texas Health and Human Services to assist d/Deaf, Hard of Hearing, and Deaf blind persons with advocacy, self-empowerment, assistance with college tuition, and equal access according to the ADA. They also specialize in community outreach and first responder training. Ask for Aliza or Felicia.

Specialized Telecommunication Assistance Program (STAP): Assists people with a hearing disadvantage to purchase basic specialized assistive equipment or services. Ask for Rodney.

Interpretive services bridge the communication gaps between the d/Deaf and the Hearing community. Ask for Jim.
